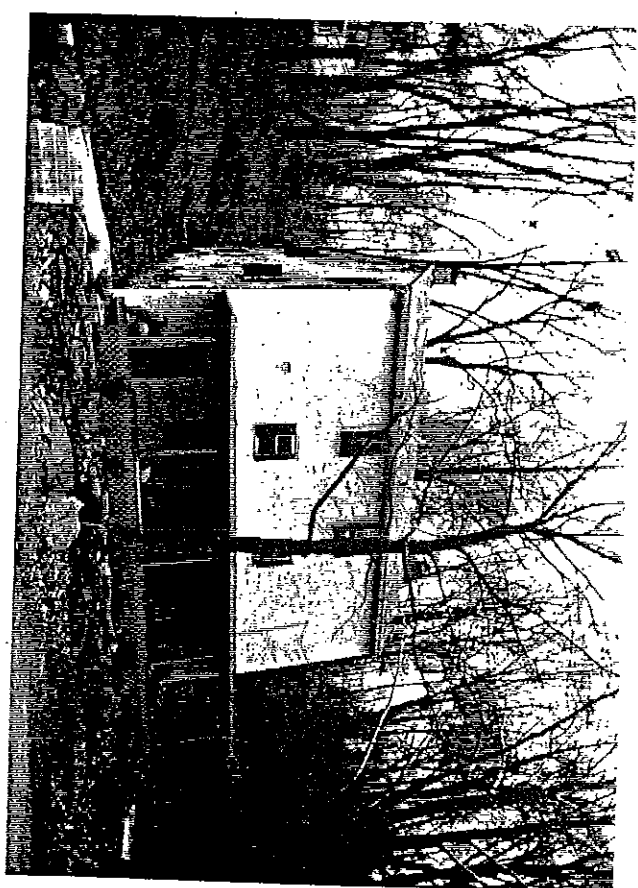
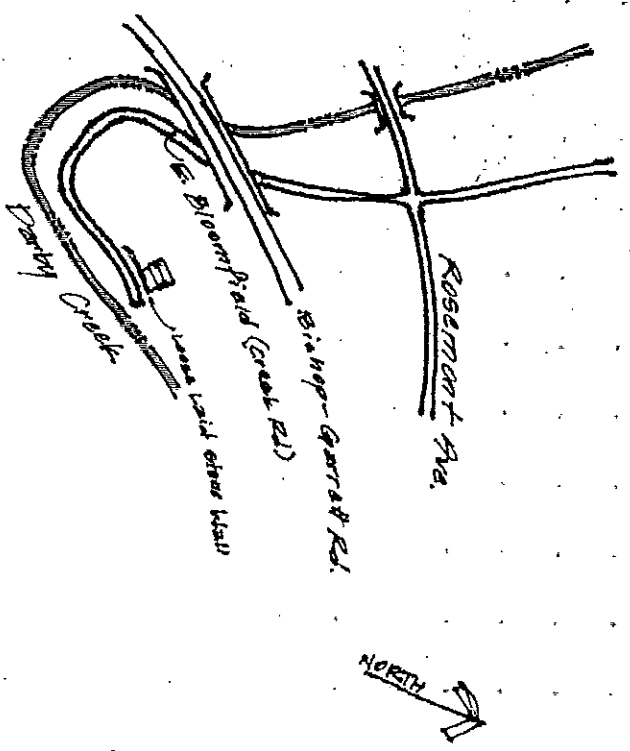

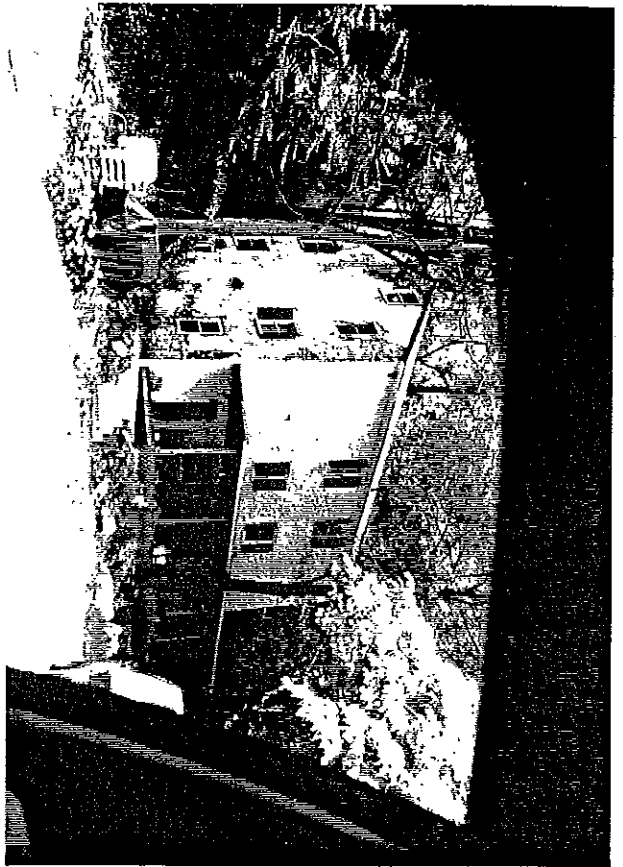

PHYSICAL DESCRIPTION:

Valley House is a 4 bay, 2 pile, 3-story, c. 1851 stuccoed stone bank house with gable roof and two gable interior chimneys. It has paired off-center entries at the façade ends. A modern one-story shed roof porch extends the full length on the facade. All windows were recently replaced with 1/1 sashes, and modern vertical board shutters. This building was in a badly deteriorated state, and was renovated by the renters under very general guidelines.

HISTORICAL NARRATIVE:

This structures is one of two remaining examples of mill worker housing built by George Burnley immediately adjacent to his Tuscarora Mills. The house now sits within a one-acre park owned by Upper Darby Township. The house is rented to tenants for a minimal fee; they are required to "restore" and maintain the house.
